



FELLOWSHIP IN DIAGNOSTIC EXCELLENCE

Do you know someone that is eligible to become a Fellow in Diagnostic Excellence?

The Society to Improve Diagnosis in Medicine (SIDM) can help match your learners with experienced mentors who are leaders in the fields of diagnostic error education, research, or practice improvement.

A SIDM fellowship can supplement a primary postgraduate medical fellowship or augment faculty or professional career development. In this one-year mentoring program, we will:

- Assign a personal mentor in your area of desired expertise in diagnosis
- Facilitate networking within the diagnostic medicine field
- Provide educational opportunities in the form of webinars and journal clubs
- Offer career path guidance

QUALIFICATIONS

Successful candidates will have advanced training (MD or advanced practice degree or other significant qualifying experience) and possess a commitment to a career in improving diagnosis and/or addressing diagnostic error. Selection will be based on the candidate qualifications and the quality of their proposed project.

In addition to the fellowships noted above, SIDM and the Gordon and Betty Moore Foundation are offering funded Fellowship positions that will provide a stipend for work done as part of an institutional degree program.

To receive the foundation-funded Fellowship, candidates must intend to pursue additional education and training related to improving diagnostic quality and safety. Successful candidates will be in an advanced degree-bearing program (or applying for and eventually be accepted), have local mentors, and commit to proposed work related to diagnostic excellence.
